
## **LGBTQ ASIAN AMERICAN & PACIFIC ISLANDER COMMUNITIES**

More than **AAPI** same-sex

couples are raising children.

An estimated 25 percent of LGBTQ **AAPI individuals experience** psychological distress, at rates higher than any other group straight or LGBTQ - and at rates more than four times higher than their straight AAPI counterparts.

As of March 2015, LGBTQ **AAPI** individuals experience unemployment at twice the **U.S.** national rate

# The Funding



Over the last ten years, funding for LGBTQ AAPI communities has fluctuated quite a bit.

#### **TOP 5 FUNDERS**

Between 2012 and 2013, foundation funding for LGBTQ AAPI communities totaled **\$1.8 million**. Only

**Arcus Foundation** \$350,600

**Ford Foundation** \$350,000


**Asian Americans/Pacific Islanders in** Philanthropy (AAPIP) \$177,124

**Liberty Hill Foundation** (Los Angeles, CA) \$172,000

**Levi Strauss Foundation** \$108,000

Collectively, they are responsible for more than 60 percent of all LGBTQ AAPI funding.

### **STRATEGIES FUNDED**




Nearly half of all LGBTQ AAPI funding went towards advocacy work while nearly a third supported capacity-building and training.

### Issues Funded

Nearly 60 percent of the funding was awarded to advance LGBTQ civil rights.

Of the more than §1 million awarded to advance LGBTQ AAPI civil rights, only \$50,000 was awarded for immigration issues.



Of the more than \$100,000 awarded for health and well-being, \$0 were awarded to support mental health, substance abuse, and suicide prevention.


